Vacation Bible School - Paritá

This summer we were able to hold Vacation Bible School for children in four of our churches - Castanhal, Bujaru, Acu and Paritá. We had a total of 215 children come. The theme was the story of Jesus' miracle of the miraculous catch of fish. The children were encouraged to follow Jesus who not only provides our needs but calls us to be "fishers of men" for His Kingdom.

Our medical boat spent 5 days on the Moju River to hold our first Vacation Bible School (VBS) at Paritá. Along with the VBS for children, we had two nights of youth services and a one-day clinic where 120 patients were treated by a team of doctors, nurses, dentists and physical therapists. It was a wonderful time of sharing the gospel, loving the children and seeing new families and young people coming to the services. We visited many families living along the river and saw two people miraculously touched by the Lord through prayer. One was a man with such severe back pain from a compressed disk that he was unable to get out of bed for four days. When the youth on our team prayed for him, the pain immediately left and he was able to get up and walk. Another miracle occurred with his wife whose ankle was swollen to double the normal size because of rheumatism. She could hardly stand on her feet. When we prayed for her the swelling went down, the pain left and she was able to resume her house work and care for her elderly mother.

A very special part of our time at Paritá was a trip we made into a smaller tributary off the main Moju River. This small river is called Jambu Açu. We

visited some of the homes and two of the families with 8 children came to the Vacation Bible School. We have been praying for over 15 years to reach the families on this river and now God is giving us the workers and the resources to go.
