She said that their greatest joy was seeing a genuine relationship with Jesus developed in the lives of the Papua New Guinea believers to the point that the work could go on even after she and Victor left. What an example to all of us!

Baptism for New Believers

Six new believers were baptized in May in the Castanhal church. One of those baptized was Hildo, a young man who was involved in drugs, alcohol and theft. Scott gave him a job at the mission house as a painter and our family has been sharing the Lord with him and praying for him for over two years. It is beautiful to now see him free from his past. Flávio and Daniela were another young couple baptized as well as three other young men.
